On Saturday, Urbana University and Walsh University renew their annual rivalry that started 15 seasons ago with the beginnings of the Cavalier Football Program. The schools met 13 times as conference opponents in the Mid-States Football Association. Walsh won the first 12 meetings, but Urbana won the 13th and final meeting as conference opponents in 2007. In 2008, Urbana began the transition to NCAA Division II and left the MSFA. Last season, in the first meeting between the school's as non-conference opponents, Walsh defeated Urbana at Fawcett Stadium 30-21.

Series History The Blue Knights and Cavaliers have played every season since Walsh's 1st season in 1995. Malone University is the only other school Walsh has played every season since its inception in '95. The streak of 15 straight seasons is the longest active streak Urbana has against any of its opponents. (The 2nd longest active streak is 6 straight seasons playing against Ohio Dominican University.) After today's game, there will only be one other team Urbana has played more than Walsh. That team is Tiffin University, who Urbana played in its first 17 years of existence, but has not played since. The Urbana-Walsh rivalry had been entirely one-sided until 2007. Walsh won the first 12 meetings between the 2 schools until the Blue Knights ended that streak with a hard-fought 9-6 victory 2 seasons ago. During Walsh's 12-year dominance, the Cavaliers beat the Blue Knights by an average score of 34-12. Ironically, the closest the Blue Knights came to a victory during that stretch was during Urbana Head Coach Dave Taynor's senior season in 1998. Taynor, an All-American center that season, captained a squad that traveled to Canton, Ohio and lost 27-21 on an overtime TD. Assistant coach Rod Wilson was a junior on that team. He started at free safety that day, and finished 2nd on the team in tackles that season with 73. Wilson also blocked a kick and had 7 pass break-ups in '99.

Season Record: 1-1 		



Walsh and Urbana engaged in an epic defensive battle on a far-from-ordinary hot and muggy October afternoon. With the temperature soaring to nearly 90 degrees, Walsh's power run game could not get started. Urbana held the Cavaliers to just 62 yards rushing on 44 attempts, less than 1.5 yards per carry. The Cavaliers didn't have much luck passing the ball either, totaling just 88 yards through the air on just 8 completions. Ten of Walsh's 15 possessions ended in 3 plays or less, and the Cavaliers had 5 drives that ended with a net total of negative 48 yards. Urbana scored the only touchdown of the day in the 2nd quarter after sophomore LB **Chad Kinkead** forced Walsh RB Clinton Blossomgame to fumble on his own 13-yard line. Walsh tied the game at 6 with a 36-yard FG at the end of the half, and Urbana kicker Jacob Harfman (now playing for the USC Trojans) kicked the game-winning 22-yard FG with 2:53 remaining in the game. Walsh made one last desperate drive to try to tie the game, but back-to-back-to-back sacks by Brian Wetzler, **Shawn Lewis** and Kyle Lockett ended the Cavaliers chances. The Blue Knight defense recorded an astounding 10 sacks for -63 yards on the day.

Eleven current Blue Knights contributed to the win that day. Kinkead (11 tackles, 1 sack, 1 forced fumble) and Lewis (8 tackles, 5 TFL, 2 sacks, 1 QB hurry) were the only starters. Also appearing in the win were **Travis Brisco** (4 tackles, 2 sacks, 2 QB hurries), **Ian Iler**, **Jerrod Slater**, **Boise Moon** (1 punt return), **Josh Turnbo** (1 tackle), **Steve Gibson**, **Eli Oliver**, **Tariq Kalimullah**, and **Derric Montgomery** (1 tackle).

Back-to-Back BKSAs Sophomore QB **Evan Gehlert** and fifth-year senior kicker **Matt Hausheer** were named the Blue Knight Student-Athlete of the Weeks in back-to-back weeks recently. Hausheer played the hero at the Blue Knights' first home game, a 20-19 win over West Virginia Wesleyan College as time expired. Hausheer kicked a 33-yard field goal with 4 seconds remaining that just cleared the crossbar after being tipped by a Bobcat at the line of scrimmage. For his clutch kick, Hausheer was also named D2Football.com's Independent Special Teams Player of the Week. The game-winner was Hausheer's first of his career as time expired. Twice in his career, Hausheer has kicked a 4th quarter FG that proved to be a game-winner. Both of these instances came in 2005. The first came on 9/3/05 against Seton Hill. Just 3 weeks later, Hausheer kicked a 24-yard FG that would prove to be the game-winner against Olivet Nazarene University.

The week after Hausheer's BKSAs win, Gehlert took the top prize with a then career-high 254-yard passing day in UU's 13-10 upset win over the University of Dayton. Gehlert was clutch on the Blue Knights' game-winning drive, converting two key 3-downs. His biggest throw of the day came on a 3rd-and-5 on UD's 26-yard line. Gehlert rolled right before throwing back across the field to his left and hitting senior TE **Tariq Kalimullah** for the game-clinching 26-yard TD. The day after being named BKSAs, Gehlert had his best game as a Blue Knight, throwing for a new career-high 371 yards on 23-of-53 passing with 4 TDs and 0 interceptions against Tusculum. His 53 passing attempts was just 2 shy of the UU record set by Frank Carrico against Walsh in 1998 (Head Coach Dave Taynor was the starting center that day. UU lost 27-21 in OT.) Gehlert is currently on pace to set single season records for:

Pass Attempts (Record: 417 by Frank Carrico ('98) - Gehlert's Pace: 476)

Pass Completions (Record: 209 by Frank Carrico ('98) - Gehlert's Pace: 250)

Passing TDs (Record: 21 by Frank Carrico ('98) - Gehlert's Pace: 22)

Passing Yards (Record: 2,826 by Frank Carrico ('98) - Gehlert's Pace: 2,862)

Your New Sack King Linebacker **Travis Brisco** wreaked havoc in the Tusculum backfield last Saturday. For his record-breaking performance, he was recognized as D2Football.com's Defensive Player of the Week. Brisco finished his impressive day against Tusculum with a school-record 5 quarterback sacks. He broke his own record which he set 2 years ago after a 4-sack game against Malone. The junior from Columbus, Ohio finished his day with 12 tackles, 2 forced fumbles, and 5 quarterback hurries. Brisco's 5 tackles for a loss also tied a school-record that he already shared with past All-Americans Mitch Murphy and Charles Boyd and 2007 All-American **Shawn Lewis**. Lewis' 5 TFL came in Urbana's 9-6 win over Walsh in 2007.

Through the first 4 games of the season, Brisco leads the Blue Knights in tackles (39), tackles for a loss (8), sacks (6), quarterback hurries (6) and forced fumbles (2). After Saturday's performance, Brisco is now the all-time career leader in quarterback sacks at Urbana with 25 in his 2+ seasons as a Blue Knight. Brisco is the current record-holder for sacks in a game (5), a season (13 in 2007) and a career (25).

Urbana University Receives Green Light from NCAA

Urbana embarks on final year before full membership in July 2010

URBANA, Ohio (July 10, 2009) – This week, Urbana University received official notice that the NCAA Membership Committee had approved the schools' transition to an NCAA Division II Provisional Membership.

Urbana University Athletic Director Doug Young acquired the good news via a conference call with the NCAA's Assistant Director of Membership Affairs, Jess Rigler.

"I won't delay the suspense any longer," hinted Rigler. "The NCAA Membership Committee voted to approve the advancement of Urbana University to provisional status for the upcoming school year."

The gathered mass of Blue Knight coaches, faculty and staff celebrated the announcement that marked the end of the school's mandatory two-year candidacy phase.

"We have looked forward to this announcement for quite awhile," Young remarked.

"The transition to NCAA Division II is made possible thanks to the continuing efforts of so many members of our campus community," added Young. "Today's announcement serves as recognition for all of their hard work and dedication."

As a provisional member, Urbana University will undergo a one-year "dress rehearsal" before becoming a full-fledged NCAA Division II member in July of 2010. The NCAA will closely monitor the schools' progress in several criteria, including academic compliance, recruiting, and scholarship procedures among others.

The NCAA Membership Committee visited Urbana's campus in March of this year. Following two years of exploratory membership, the University received high praise for its continuing progress and compliance with NCAA rules.

"Urbana did a fantastic job on its annual report and showed major progress from the first to the second year of exploratory status," explained Rigler.

With 2 years down and 1 to go, the Blue Knights kick off the home football season at noon on Saturday, September 5th against NCAA D-II opponent West Virginia Wesleyan.



A Clash of Styles Today's matchup will feature 2 completely different offensive styles. Urbana loves to air it out, while Walsh likes to establish the run. On the season, Urbana has dropped back to pass almost exactly twice as often as it has run the ball (201 pass plays to 104 rushing plays). Walsh, on the other hand, has done the exact opposite (128 rushes to 64 pass attempts). When Urbana rushes the ball, they use a committee of running backs. **Nigel Smith** (27 rushes), **Quinton Jones** (24 rushes) and **Matt Allen** (24 rushes) have shared the duties, and WRs **Ian Iler** (12 rushes) and **Boise Moon** (5 rushes) have also gotten into the action in the backfield. Walsh has 1 feature back, **Clinton Blossomgame**. Blossomgame averages more rush attempts per game (30) than any Blue Knight has accumulated in their first 4 games combined. Blossomgame has also racked up more rushing yards (467) through his first 3 games than all of the Urbana RB's have total in 4 games (302). However, Urbana's run defense has been stellar in the past 2 games, holding opponents to just 36 total yards on 51 carries (0.71 yards per carry).

While Walsh holds an advantage running the ball, the Blue Knights have a clear advantage in the passing game. In fact, UU QB **Evan Gehlert** averages more completions per game (23) than Walsh QB **Jim Shiplett** averages pass attempts per game (21). Also, Walsh has yet to score a TD through the air, while Gehlert already has 8 passing TDs. Both QBs have thrown 3 INTs, but Gehlert is averaging a pick every 68 dropbacks, while Shiplett averages 1 INT for every 22 dropbacks.

0.8

Just 1 week after holding the Flyers to 0.5 yards per rush, the Blue Knights' defense backed up that performance by holding Tusculum to 0.8 yards per rush. In UU's last 2 games, they have held their opponents to 36 yards on 51 carries. In the first 2 games of the season, teams rushed for 489 yards on 99 carries.

2

Against Tusculum, 2 Urbana offensive lineman recorded solo tackles on punt coverage. Redshirt freshman **Ethan Oakley** had a solo tackle in the 2nd quarter, and in the 4th quarter, senior **Justin Burum** put a devastating hit on the Pioneer return man, forcing a fumble that fellow O-lineman **Steve Gibson** recovered.

3

Three times this season, the Brothers Kinkead have assisted each other on a tackle. Freshman **Bret Kinkead** is a defensive lineman and part-time longsnapper for UU with 7 tackles and 1 sack this season. His older brother, **Chad Kinkead**, is a senior linebacker with a team-high 215 career tackles.

4

Senior tight end **Tariq Kalimullah** has caught a touchdown pass in each of the Blue Knights' first 4 games this season. That streak is the longest by a Blue Knight since Marc Burr caught a TD pass in 5 straight games at the end of the 2006 season.

11

Senior kicker **Matt Hausheer** is just one record away from his 11th kicking record. He broke his 9th and 10th records (Career FGAs and Career FGs) with his game-winning 33-yard FG as time expired against WVWC in Week 2. He is currently tied with former UU QB Frank Carrico for the most records all-time at Urbana. Hausheer will grab record #11 today with his next kicking point.

35

The 35 points scored by Urbana in the loss to Tusculum is the most scored by the Blue Knights since the final week of the 2007 season. UU scored 42 in a win over Marian that day. The last time UU scored 35 and lost was Week 7 of the 2001 season. St. Francis (Ind.) defeated the Blue Knights 42-38 on that day 8 years ago.

202

After a 202-yard outburst last week, WR/RB **Ian Iler** has taken over the team lead in All-Purpose Yards per game from return specialist **Troy Brookins**. Iler had 154 yards receiving, 41 kick return yards, and 7 rushing yards against Tusculum. He is averaging 110.8 APY per game, which is slightly better than Brookins' 104.5, but just off the record pace of 113.6 set by Bobby Mason in 2004.

FINDLAY, Ohio (Aug. 27, 2009) - The Blue Knights experienced a bit of déjà vu in their season opener against Findlay. In last year's opener, Findlay shut out Urbana 26-0 at Blue Knights Stadium. Tonight, the Blue Knights fell behind 28-0 in a 42-21 loss at Findlay's Donnell Stadium.

URBANA, Ohio (Sep. 5, 2009) - The final 32 seconds of today's game saw two game-winning drives, two blocked kicks, and two lead changes. When the dust had finally settled and the celebrations had ended, the Blue Knights stood victorious by a score of 20-19 over the visiting Bobcats.

UF scored touchdowns on their first 2 possessions. Findlay capitalized on a couple Blue Knight turnovers right before the half to take the 28-point lead.

Urbana led throughout most of the game, but the Bobcats mounted a furious charge in the game's final moments. The Bobcats took their 1st lead of the game at 19-17 with just 32 seconds left when QB Zane Zebrasky found WR Lavaughn Hughes for an 8-yard touchdown. UU's Wes Edwards gave the Blue Knights a glimmer of hope when he blocked the PAT.

Urbana got on the board later in the third when **Evan Gehlert** found tight end **Tariq Kalimullah** for a 10-yard touchdown. At the start of the 4th quarter, the Blue Knights showed some life. They led off the quarter with a 13-play scoring drive to cut the deficit to 35-14. **Gehlert** connected with sophomore wide receiver **Diamond Hart** for the 8-yard score.

On second down with 18 seconds remaining, Gehlert found a streaking Ian Iler for a 27-yard pickup. With 12 seconds on the clock, Gehlert found Jerrell Leak across the middle for 14-yard gain to get the Blue Knights to Wesleyan's 16-yard line.

Findlay's Demetrius Trapps appeared to stop the Blue Knight threat with his second touchdown run of 40-plus yards, but Urbana refused to quit. Blue Knight **Troy Brookins** delivered with his second big play of the night when he returned the ensuing Oiler kickoff 87 yards for a score. Urbana then recovered an onside kick to keep hope alive, but a Findlay interception sealed the Blue Knights' fate.

After a short timeout, kicker Matt Hausheer took the field to attempt the game-winning field goal with 4 seconds left on the clock. The 33-yard attempt was partially blocked at the line. The ball wobbled low on a line drive and just barely cleared the crossbar, giving the Blue Knights the 1-pt. win.

Urbana is a newcomer to NCAA Division II and has played just 235 games in the school's 25-year history. To call Urbana's 13-10 win over Dayton an "upset" is a little bit of an understatement.

the Blue Knights outplayed the Flyers in nearly every phase of the football game. Urbana's defense was nearly impenetrable. For the game, the Blue Knights outgained the Flyers 296 to 183. They held UD to just 10 total yards on the ground, and the offense provided key drives and converted big 3rd down conversions whenever the team needed it most.

The Blue Knights played brilliantly in the first half, outgaining the Flyers 147 yards to 92. Urbana's run defense was stout, holding UD to -10 yards rushing in the 2nd quarter, and the offense was efficient. RB **Matt Allen** gave the Blue Knights a 7-3 lead with a 1-yard touchdown run with 7:54 to play in the half. UD answered at the end of the quarter with a 2-minute drive that took the Flyers into field goal range. The 9-play drive was quickly halted when Blue Knight DB **Dan Goodrum** intercepted a Flyer pass in the end zone.

QB **Evan Gehlert** orchestrated a 9-play, 87-yard drive late in the 4th quarter that included a couple of huge 3rd down conversions. With just over 5 minutes left, Gehlert found TE **Tariq Kalimullah** for a 26-yard touchdown on a 3-and-5 play. The Blue Knights defense answered the challenge, with just over a minute to play. UD had one more opportunity to get into field goal range to tie the game. That opportunity came to a screeching halt on the first play of the drive when DE **Shawn Lewis** hit the Flyer quarterback as he was trying to release a pass. The ball flipped out and landed right in the hands of **Chad Kinkead** for the biggest win in school history.

GAME 4 RECAP - TUSCULUM at URBANA

URBANA, Ohio (Sep. 19, 2009) - Under ideal conditions, the Tusculum and Urbana offenses thrived this afternoon. The teams combined for over a 1,000 yards and several records were broken in Tusculum's 45-35 shootout win. The Blue Knights struck 1st on the game's opening drive. **Evan Gehlert** found **Jerrell Leak** on an 18-yard touchdown, capping a 7-play 72-yard drive. Only 3 minutes had passed in the ball game, but amazingly, that drive would prove to be the longest of a game that featured 80 points. Tusculum answered with 4 straight scoring drives of their own to take a 28-7 lead with just over 2 minutes remaining in the first half. With 1:36 remaining in the 2nd quarter, Gehlert connected with **Boise Moon** on a 55-yard TD. After the Blue Knights forced a 3-and-out, Tusculum lined up to punt with just under a minute before the break. Urbana LB **Traylin Taylor** provided a spark when he leaped over a Tusculum blocker and blocked the punt. Urbana recovered and scored in just 11 seconds. Gehlert found **Tariq Kalimullah**, for a 3-yard TD to cut the deficit down to 7 points heading into the half.

The Blue Knights faced a 17-point deficit in the 4th, but they did not quit. Gehlert threw his career-high 4th TD of the day to **Ian Iler**. Urbana got back within 10 with just over 7 minutes to play. After another Blue Knight blocked punt, this time by DB **Dan Goodrum**, Urbana got the ball back in good field position with plenty of time for a comeback. Unfortunately, on the ensuing drive's first play, Gehlert was blindsided by a Pioneer defender and the ball was knocked loose. The Pioneers recovered and began milking the clock. The Blue Knight defense made a goal line stand on 4th down and got the ball back in the hands of the offense. Urbana marched into Tusculum territory, but with the clock on their opponents' side, the Blue Knights turned the ball over on downs. Tusculum took a knee to run out the remainder of the time. The Pioneers escaped with the 45-35 win.

WALSH: THE SCOUTING REPORT

The Walsh University Cavaliers come into Urbana today with a 2-1 record and a #24 ranking in the NAIA coaches’ poll. Last week Walsh shocked NAIA #20 Ohio Dominican 23-16, and the Cavaliers’ only loss came from a ranked NCAA D-II opponent, West Liberty State.

Offensively, Walsh is averaging 21.3 ppg and 306 total yds/gm which ranks them 49th and 56th in the NAIA, respectively. Their strongest stat is rushing where they rank 24th in the NAIA with 176.0 yds/gm.

Leading the rushing attack is junior running back **Clinton Blossomgame**. He ranks 3rd in the NAIA in rushing yards (150.0 Yds/Gm), T-23rd in scoring (8.0 Pts/Gm) and 17th in All-Purpose yards (152.7 Yds/Gm). Blossomgame handled most of the workload in the week 3 upset over Ohio Dominican, racking up 226 yards and 2 touchdowns off 48 rushes. That effort earned him Mid-States Football Association Player of the Week honors.

When Blossomgame doesn't get it done on the ground, Walsh turns to quarterback **Jim Shiplett**. Shiplett has yet to throw a touchdown pass but has rushed for two. Unfortunately for Walsh, Shiplett has thrown an interception in each of his first three games and has a 85.56 efficiency rating which ranks him in the bottom half of the NAIA. Shiplett's favorite target is junior wide receiver **Joe Morgan**. Morgan is averaging 85.5 receiving yds/gm which is 24th in the NAIA, and he has 15 receptions so far this season.

Defensively, Walsh is giving up 378.7 yds/gm and 26.7 ppg. The defense is led by linebackers **Jason Stiel** and **Aaron Donze**. Stiel has recorded 21 tackles so far this year and Donze has 19. The defense has 4 different players with interceptions on the year so far. The team leaders in sacks are **Justin Brown** and **Aaron Forte** each with 2.

Special teams is a bright spot for Walsh. Their kick return team ranks 5th in the NAIA (27.0 yd/avg) and their punt return team ranks 9th (19.5yd/avg). Leading the way is **Brian Williams** a senior defensive back who is 5th in kick return average (34.3 yds/rtn). The Cavaliers field goal kicker is **Eric Buchanan** who is 3 for 5 on the year with a long of 40 yards. Punter **Adam Castin** is averaging 34.1 yds/punt and already has 8 punts downed inside the 20 yard line in just 3 games.

HEAD COACH DAVID TAYNOR (URBANA, '99)



David Taynor became the ninth head football coach at Urbana University on April 24, 2008. Taynor, a 1999 graduate of Urbana, returned to his alma mater to accept his first head coaching position.

During his playing career at Urbana, Taynor was a first team all-Mid-States Football Association offensive lineman for the Blue Knights. After a stellar senior season, Taynor earned NAIA All-American honors in 1998, becoming only the second All-American in Urbana football history.

Taynor, a captain his senior year at

Urbana, was also an NAIA Scholar Athlete, in addition to being a two-time all-MSFA Scholar Athlete.

"I'm extremely excited about becoming a head football coach, but more importantly, becoming a head football coach here," said Taynor. "This University has done a lot for me and my career. For me to be able to come back and be a part of an exciting time of transition to NCAA D II and be a leader here is something very special to me."

Taynor is returning to his roots after being mentored by some college coaching greats, and developing a strong and diverse knowledge of the game of football. He has learned the necessary leadership experience to effectively mentor student athletes and build a successful football program.

"Football has always been a passion of mine," said Taynor. "Without college football, my coaches and teammates, I would not have had the structure. That is why I got into coaching. The development of young men is my goal. I want them to be proud of what they've accomplished, where they've been and where they're going."

Taynor comes to Urbana from Tiffin University where he was the offensive coordinator/offensive line coach from 2006-2008. He also served as an academic advisor for the Dragons' football program. During his tenure as offensive coordinator, Tiffin University established itself as a balanced and record-setting unit. Over two seasons the Dragons accumulated a 19-3 record and won the Great Lakes Football Conference championship in 2007. During that 2007 season, the Tiffin offense broke 18 team or individual university records.

Before his stint at Tiffin, Taynor served under head coach John Miech at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point as offensive line coach in 2004. He was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2005. At UW-Stevens Point, Taynor coordinated a defense that produced four all-Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference players and a first team all-Region defensive end in 2005. In 2004, his UW-Stevens Point line propelled the offense to a top two finish in the WIAC in total offense, scoring



and passing efficiency. He coached two first team all-conference linemen and a second team all-American tight end.

Taynor's first full-time college coaching job was as the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach for Culver-Stockton College in Canton, Mo. from 2001-04 with head coach Chris Tabor, who is now a special teams assistant coach with the Chicago Bears. Taynor's offense finished third in the nation (NAIA) in total offense and second in passing, while breaking 35 individual or team records for offensive proficiency during the 2002 season. He also served as the team's NFL liaison.

Taynor got his collegiate coaching start as an assistant coach for the Blue Knights in 1999. He then moved on to the University of Louisville as a graduate assistant (1999-2001), working for Coach John L. Smith. The Cardinals were crowned Conference USA champions in 2000, and Taynor coached in the 1999 Humanitarian Bowl and 2000 Liberty Bowl. During his time in Louisville, Taynor had the opportunity to assist in the strength training of four NFL draft picks and 14 athletes who were invited to NFL camps.

Taynor received his master's degree in higher education at the University of Louisville in 2000 and his bachelor's degree in sports science from Urbana University in 1999.

David and his wife, Heather (Rose) Taynor, a 1998 Urbana University graduate and three-year letter winner for the Blue Knight softball team, currently reside in Findlay, Ohio.
